Unfinished Business

Kristen Johnson joined the meeting via phone. She explained that the surveying will be completed at the end of February. They will incorporate the survey information into the Gannett Fleming base map. There will be a meeting with the Borough to discuss the current sewer agreement Monday, February 24, 2025 at 3:00 p.m. at the New Wilmington Borough Building.

One sealed bid was received for a snow blower: Justin Shaker - \$10,000. Mr. Bolinger will abstain from any motions regarding this purchase due to his relationship with the seller. An abstention form is attached to the minutes. Mr. Whiting made a motion to table the purchase of the snow blower until the March meeting, Mr. Steingrabe seconded. Roll call vote: Joseph Whiting – yes, Robert Steingrabe – yes, Donald Bolinger – abstain. Mr. Shaker has the option to withdraw his bid since the bid was not accepted nor rejected at this meeting.

New Business

Mr. Whiting made a motion to accept Resolution 2025-5, placing Bryan Cummings on the Planning Commission, seconded by Mr. Steingrabe. Roll call vote: Joseph Whiting – yes, Robert Steingrabe – yes, Donald Bolinger – yes.

The garbage contract expires June 30, 2025. Ms. Black has inquired whether Tri-County Industries would like to extend the contract another year.

The county real estate tax rate has increased 3.6 mills.

Mr. Steingrabe made a motion to use 100 ton on the salt contract for the 2025-2026 season, seconded by Mr. Bolinger. Roll call vote: Joseph Whiting – yes, Robert Steingrabe – yes, Donald Bolinger – yes.

The March Schools will take place every Thursday evening in March from 7-9 p.m. at the Penn State Extension Office.
