

The Wilmington Township Mercer County Board of Supervisors met on February 11, 2026, at the township building. The meeting was called to order at 7:04 p.m. by Bryan Cummings with Robert Steingrabe and Joseph Whiting in attendance. Guests present were Marilyn and Greg Seech, Tim Coulter, Josh Kalp and Pastor Rob Cypher. The pledge to the flag was given.

Public Comment

Marilyn Seech discussed the possible park and pavilion remodel. She was asking for final approval to move forward with the project. The supervisors felt that the sewer project needs to be addressed before we can move forward with the park/pavilion.

The January 5, 2026 meeting minutes were approved by a motion from Mr. Whiting, seconded by Mr. Steingrabe. Roll call vote: Bryan Cummings – yes, Joseph Whiting – yes, Robert Steingrabe – yes.

Unfinished Business

Josh Kalp from EADS group attended the meeting to discuss the sewer project. He explained that the township and Borough need to reach an agreement before we can move on with the project. The Act 537 Plan and the H2O grant are contingent on the agreement. The project design is significantly finished. The surveyor hopes to have the survey of Auction and Mercer New Wilmington Roads complete by the end of March. Ms. Harvey will send Kristen Gresock the contact for the H2O grant to try to get an extension as well as continue to contact the solicitor and Borough about the progress of the agreement.

New Business

The Planning Commission did not meet.

Mr. Steingrabe motioned to amend the ATV Ordinance 2025-2, to include adding a weight limit of 2500 lbs., adding must have working head lamp and tail lamp, add that operators must follow all posted traffic and state laws, and remove Briarwood Lane, Maplewood Drive, Valley View Drive, and Willow Drive, seconded by Mr. Whiting. Roll call vote: Bryan Cummings – yes, Joseph Whiting – yes, Robert Steingrabe – yes.

Mr. Cummings discussed the idea of having better cyber insurance and he will be looking into possible companies that specialize in cyber security for municipalities.

Mr. Steingrabe motioned to double seal coat Bend Road Hill, seconded by Mr. Cummings. Roll call vote: Bryan Cummings – yes, Joseph Whiting – yes, Robert Steingrabe – yes.

The garbage contract expires June 30, 2026. Ms. Harvey has inquired whether Tri-County Industries would like to extend the contract another year. Mel at Tri-County will be in contact with a possible extension.

A concern was raised about the septic pumping schedule at Valley View Apartments. The owners have been pumping the septic once a month regularly. Once the snow clears, SEO Pat Kelley will check the system halfway between each pumping to determine if they need to schedule more than one pumping a month.

The March Schools will take place every Thursday evening in March from 7-9 p.m. at the Penn State Extension Office.
