The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Bryan Cummings, with Robert Steingrabe and Joseph Whiting in attendance. Guests present were Ann Coleman, Bryan Sullivan, and Pastor Rob Cypher. Martuccio Asphalt was awarded the sealcoating job at the joint sealcoat meeting at 1.226/square yard. Youngblood's bid was 1.310/square yard and Russell Standard's bid was 1.970/square yard.
