Tri-County Industries will hold its Spring Clean Up for the township on June 5, along with your regular pick-up. Items should be placed at the curb by midnight on June 4. This service is available only to residents who have a current, active account with Tri County for garbage services.

#### The following will not be allowed for pick-up:

Tires, dirt, or sod

- Batteries
- Construction debris

Hazardous materials/chemicals

- Items containing freon unless coolant has been removed and certified
- Liquids paint cans must be opened and dried Propane tanks

E-waste such as TVs, computers, printers, etc. Fluorescent bulbs

### **Property Tax & Rent Rebate Clinic**

Representative Tim Bonner's office will hold a Property Tax/ Rent Rebate Clinic at the township building on March 26 from 10:00 am until noon.

The rebate program benefits eligible Pennsylvanians age 65 and older; widows and widowers age 50 and older; and people with disabilities age 18 and older. The income limit is \$45,000 a year for homeowners and renters.

The maximum standard rebate is \$1000, but supplemental rebates for qualifying homeowners can boost rebates to \$1500.

Please bring copies of the tax statements marked paid from your county, school district and municipality, as well as any IRS 1099 forms. For renters, provide a rent certificate filled out and signed by your landlord. For direct deposit, provide deposit slip or voided check. First-time filers need to provide proof of age.



If you would like some dirt scraped from along the roads and ditches, please contact the township. If you live near an area we are working, we can try to accommodate your needs.

### **Upcoming Sewer Project**

The township is in the beginning phase of its sewer project. A \$400,000 grant was awarded to the township towards this project. There is a lot of work needing done before final costs will be known and a lot of details need ironed out. Once we are at the point that we have concrete information, a township meeting will be held to inform the residents of these details. A mailing will be sent about this meeting to all residents within the sewer project. This project will involve Cowden Road, Maplewood Drive, Valley View Drive, Willow Drive, Auction Road, Mercer-New Wilmington Road from the borough line to one home past Dollar General, and Bethel New Wilmington Road from the borough line to one house past Willow Drive.
